#### December 2006

• Two of the partners in the OlyWest undertaking decide to withdraw due to financial and industry re organization pressures. Review of both provincial and federal subsidies and loans for the plant underway.

- City of Winnipeg approves \$3.4 million economic incentive plan for OlyWest this includes 60 acres of land with an option to purchase an additional 40 acres in the St. Boniface Industrial Park and \$2.4 million over nine years towards site infrastructure development, plus a local improvement loan. - Manitoba Government commits its support for the proposed OlyWest project; \$3 million for training and recruitment, \$4.5 million towards site infrastructure development and a repayable, interest-bearing loan of \$20 million under the Manitoba Industrial Opportunities Program.
